# Resolution #2019-21 – Authority of Signature

Upon motion by Rose, seconded by Aigeldinger, Council unanimously authorized the resolution executing an agreement with PennDOT for the Borough to perform snow and ice clearance on various state roads within the borough to include:

- 1. Tunnel Road Route 563 to Borough Line
- 2. Park Avenue Route 563 to Borough Line
- 3. Constitution Avenue Borough Line to Walnut Street
- 4. Callowhill Street 5<sup>th</sup> Street to Borough Line
- 5. Market Street Ridge to 7<sup>th</sup> Street
- 6. Fifth Street Market Street to Borough Line
- 7. Main Street Walnut Street to Callowhill Street

This agreement will be observed during the winter seasons: 2019-20; 2020-21; 2021-22; 2022-23; and 2023-24.

# Consider Company for Recruitment of future Police Chief

Upon motion by Aigeldinger, seconded by Purcell, Council unanimously approved Lafayette College to recruit and interview the future Chief of Police for a price not to exceed \$8,500. They may begin as soon as possible.

## Consider allowing solicitor to draft Contract

Upon motion by Aigeldinger, seconded by Ryder, Council unanimously approved to authorize the solicitor to draft a one (1) year contract between the borough of Perkasie and the Police Officers to include a 3.5% wage increase effective January 1, 2020; increase in Life Insurance to \$250,000 per covered life effective upon approval; and a change in years credited service from twenty four (24) years to twenty two (22) years effective June 1, 2019.

# Consider Perkasie Woods Escrow Release

Upon motion by Rose, seconded by Brooks, Council unanimously approved Resolution #2019-20 to authorize a reduction in the escrow for the Perkasie Woods Subdivision as approved by Gilmore & Associates, Inc., in the amount of \$290,560.35 to reduce the total escrow to \$888,927.05 and to authorize the signature of the borough manager on the escrow reduction.

## Consider Maintenance Bond for Country Ridge

Upon motion by Purcell, seconded by Rose, Council unanimously approved to accept a cash deposit as the maintenance bond related to the dedication of the improvements in the project known as Country Ridge.

## Consider Donation to St. Isidore

Upon motion by Rose, seconded by Faulkner, Council unanimously approved to donate four (4) daily Menlo Aquatic Center passes for the 2020 season to the Knights of Columbus Saint Isidore Council Jack-O-Lantern Race.

Discussion about potential rental terms and renters for Borough 3<sup>rd</sup> Floor Tenant

Council and the Borough's real estate agent discussed the possibility of a Dentist, construction/update to the 3<sup>rd</sup> floor offices, pricing, length of lease, etc. Borough's agent will have an update in the next two weeks.
