#### PARKS & RECREATION DEVELOPMENTS

If you have been to one of our many free summer concerts this summer or visited our new updated tennis and pickleball courts then you may have noticed some fun and exciting Parks & Recreation developments!

Many of these projects were in the works before the COVID-19 pandemic, but had to be paused for a few years. This year we have been able to push forward to finalize many of these projects in the park system. Our Parks & Recreation Department, with the support of Perkasie Borough Council and the help of our Public Works and Electric Departments, is thrilled to provide an update and a look to the future.

#### **LENAPE PARK AMPHITHEATER**

In 2017, Perkasie Borough won the Oldcastle Infrastructure "Building a New Tomorrow" Program, which was intended to provide resources to the communities in which Oldcastle's employees live and work. The award gifted a precast structure to Perkasie Borough for use as an outdoor amphitheater.

The Borough's engineers and staff worked with Oldcastle designers on plans, budgets and site challenges for the amphitheater. Originally the structure was to sit on the north side of the Perkiomen Creek but concerns about the extent of the flood plain meant that its location was moved to its current spot on the south side of the creek, close to the park's volleyball court and skate park pavilion on Constitution Avenue.

Additional funding for the engineering, excavation, footers and improvements to the surrounding area was provided by a Bucks County Open Space grant.

We kicked off our 2022 Summer Concert Series this year on June 15th with a Grand Opening Event, ribbon cutting, and fun music from "The Nerds". Every






#### LIBERTY BELL TRAIL FROM 7TH STREET TO 9TH STREET

Did you know that Perkasie Borough is home to a section of the Liberty Bell Trail? This historically important trail is so named because part of the trail was traveled by the Liberty Bell in September 1777, when it was being moved from Philadelphia to Allentown for safekeeping shortly before the British occupation of Philadelphia during the American Revolutionary War.

In late 2016 Perkasie Borough signed a Multimodal Transportation Fund Grant Contract with the Commonwealth Financing Authority. The grant award provided funding to update curbs, ramps, and sidewalk on 7th Street, create a 'pocket park' at the entrance of the Trolley Tunney and extend an asphalt trail connecting 7th St to 9th.

Although the contract was awarded in 2016, the project ran into numerous delays and we requested and received multiple time extensions from PA Department of Community and Economic Development. At a Perkasie Borough Council meeting in February 2022 a bid was finally awarded to G&B Construction Group and the projected started soon after.

As a result of this project the trail has been extended from 7th St and currently ends at the top of the 9th Street rail abutments. We are already working on sourcing funding which will allow us to continue the Liberty Bell Trail down onto 9th St and beyond.





#### **TENNIS AND PICKLEBALL COURTS**

Pickleball anyone? Pickleball, enormously popular with people of all ages, is played with a paddle and a wiffle-like ball, and is America's fastest growing sport.

Perkasie's pickleball journey started in 2019 when Public Works painted our first set of pickleball lines at Kulp Tennis courts and the recreational programming and play began. Within a year the demand outgrew the court and more lines were added in 2020 along with two temporary pickleball nets funded by Bucks County Recreation Council.

The increased use of the Kulp St courts by pickleball and tennis players accelerated the Borough's plan to renovate the playing surface and courts. Early in 2022, Perkasie Borough Council approved the renovation project with Keystone Sport Construction for the full







mill, pave, resurface, and new equipment for the new Kulp Tennis and Pickleball Courts. The new design replaced 2 tennis courts with 6 pickleball courts and created 3 newly lined and resurfaced tennis courts. The project also included moving and updating the court lighting with the help of Perkasie Borough Electric Department.

#### **SECURITY CAMERAS**

Perkasie Borough Council and Perkasie's Police Department have been dealing with increased incidences of vandalism and graffiti in parts of our park system. In response, and in order to maintain and clean and safe park system for our community Perkasie Borough is working on installing security cameras in our parks. Park users may have noticed cameras at Perkasie's new Amphitheater in Lenape Park and will start to see more cameras in the area. These cameras will extend coverage to the new restrooms, Skate Park, Skate Park pavilion, Dog Park, Twin Bridges, and the surrounding fields and pathways.

Our goal is to provide assurance to community members, that they and their park system are valued and protected. We will continue to consider security at each of our park locations.

#### LOOKING TOWARD THE FUTURE...

Though we completed a few items on the park to-do list we saw firsthand how important our park system was to the community especially during the COVID-19 pandemic. The need for open space, parks, and trails was prevalent across the country. Along with the need to safely connect our community members to these places and local businesses. This is why the Perkasie Borough plans to continue to work on Park and Recreation updates.

For example, with the completion of the 7th to 9th Street Liberty Bell Trail Perkasie Borough has already applied for another Multi Modal Transportation grant for the second step of this project. These plans include stairs down from the top of 9th street trolley abutments, updated ADA access down Chestnut Street from the cemetery, and a pedestrian trial up Park Avenue. The Park Avenue portion would include curbing, walkway, and retaining wall which could complete the Liberty Bell Trail route through the borough. This pedestrian portion is part of a larger scale Park Avenue Improvement Project which includes Stormwater Management measures and a full width mill and pave. We are excited about our 2022 updates and will continue to work to provide new and exciting park and recreation opportunities for our community in the future!

When I was in college, I had the privilege of living in a house with 12 other guys. One of those guys, named Mike, was 99% blind, and I discovered after spending time with him, watching him navigate the challenges he experienced with grace and a positive attitude, that he gave me an invaluable life lesson. Mike was the kind of person that chose to not let his disability get in the way of his life experience. He ran Cross Country in high school, tethered to another runner about his speed so he could be part of the cross country team. In his sophomore year in college he decided to go to Europe, by himself, for spring break. Mike's determination to live life well, bless and encourage others, and be an inspiration not in spite of but through his disability is something I will never forget.

I noticed those same kinds of attitudes in my friend, the former Mayor John, and deeply value our relationship and ways he's inspired and encouraged many people. Are there some areas, some people, where we can do a little less taking for granted and find ways to show more value and respect? Appreciation and determination, 2 ideas that can go miles in helping us to live life well.

I appreciate this wonderful community in which I live, and am blessed to be part of it.



#### **2022 Collection and Disposal of Refuse Reminders**

#### **RECYCLING CENTER HOURS**

Monday through Friday: 7:30 am - 8:30 pm Saturdays: 7:30 am - 4:00 pm Closed Sundays and most holidays. The Borough Recycling Center, located behind the Perkasie Police Department, at 311 South 9th Street, is for the convenience of **Borough Residents ONLY**. Perkasie Borough staff may ask for identification when you use the Center. There are signs indicating where recyclable materials are to be placed. **No plastic bags, please.** Combine glass, aluminum, tin and plastic (PDE #1-7) containers in the dumpsters that are marked as such and that have metal stairs. Combine

newspaper and cardboard and place in the trailer.

Trash and bulky items are not accepted at the Recycling Center. Absolutely NO construction materials, aluminum/plastic siding, window glass, shutters, etc. are accepted at the Recycling Center. No laundry baskets, plastic trash cans, large tin (popcorn) containers, fish tanks, mirrors or other household materials are accepted. As of June 1, 2010 yard waste (NO GRASS CLIPPINGS) will be accepted on the first Saturday of the month 7:30 AM - 3:30 PM. Please use brown paper bags, lawn and leaf bags or bring a container to be dumped when disposing of yard waste. **No plastic bags.** Please call the Borough or check the website for additional information.



#### **FALL LEAF COLLECTION**

Leaf collection will begin mid-October and continue through November, weather permitting. Please look for confirmed dates on the Borough's website and social media. Rake leaves into the street along the curb line without blocking or clogging storm drains. Please keep vehicles away from areas where leaves are piled.

Leaves will be picked up when scheduling allows. There are no set collection days for areas of the Borough. The Public Works crew will follow a specific route and do so cyclically.


### CHRISTMAS TREE COLLECTION

Christmas trees (without wire) are picked up along with recyclables during the first three weeks of January. Wreaths with or without wire will be collected with refuse. Live-balled Christmas trees may be donated for planting in Borough parks.



- 1) Dispose of leaf litter and yard waste in an appropriate manner, never in the street or stream. Shred yard and leaf waste to use as mulch or fertilizer for your yard and garden.
- 2) Clear leaves and debris from gutters and storm drains. This will prevent flooding and keep debris out of our local waterways.
- 3) **Fertilize your lawn only if needed.** To save yourself time and money, have your soil tested to determine the amount of fertilizer required. Standard soil test kits can be purchased from county offices of Penn State Extension.
- 4) Plant native trees and shrubs! Fall is the best time of year to plant. Trees and shrubs provide habitat for wildlife and help rainwater soak into the ground.

#### A Message From The Perkasie Borough Police Department

The police department would like to remind all residents to double check to make sure your vehicles are kept locked, even when in your driveway. Theft from vehicles is generally a crime of opportunity with offenders looking for unlocked/unsecured vehicles that may contain cell phones, cash, computers and other valuables.

As we enter our fall season and school is back in session the police department would like to offer the following safety tips from PennDot and AAA;

#### **School Bus Safety**

School bus safety is a high priority in Pennsylvania. Students, parents, teachers, administrators, transportation personnel and the motoring public all play important roles in keeping our children safe while on or around the school bus.

#### Pennsylvania's School Bus Stopping Law

- Motorists must stop at least 10 feet away from school buses that have their red lights flashing and stop arm extended.
- Motorists must stop when they are behind a bus, meeting the bus or approaching an intersection where a bus is stopped.
- Motorists following or traveling alongside a school bus must also stop until the red lights have stopped flashing, the stop arm is withdrawn, and all children have reached safety.
- If physical barriers such as grassy medians, guide rails or concrete median barriers separate oncoming traffic from the bus, motorists in the opposing lanes may proceed without stopping.
- Do not proceed until all the children have reached a place of safety.

The penalties if convicted of violating Pennsylvania's School Bus Stopping Law include:

- \$250 fine
- Five points on your driving record
- 60-day license suspension

- Tips for Parents/Students
- Get to the school bus stop five minutes early so you won't have to run across the road to catch the bus.
- When waiting for the bus, stay away from traffic. Line up at least five giant steps away from the curb or the roadway to wait for the bus.
- Never run after the school bus if it has already left the bus stop.
- Never push when getting on or off of the school bus.
- Always walk at least 10 feet in front of the bus when crossing so that the school bus driver can see you.
- Be aware cross with care! Wait until the school bus has stopped all traffic before stepping out onto the road.
- When the school bus is moving, always stay in your seat. Never put your head, arms or hands out of the window.
- · Talk quietly; do not distract your school bus driver.
- If your school bus crosses railroad tracks, be calm and quiet so that your driver can listen for a train.
- Always obey your school bus driver's instructions, so that he or she can make safe decisions.
- Never play with the emergency exits. Backpacks, band instruments, or sports equipment may not block the aisle or emergency exits. If there is an emergency, listen to the driver and follow instructions.
- When getting off of the school bus, make sure that all drawstrings and other loose objects are secure so that they don't get caught on the handrail or the door.
- Never cross the street behind the school bus. If you leave something on the bus or drop something outside of the bus, never go back for it. The driver may not see you and begin moving the bus.
- Never speak to strangers at the bus stop and never get into the car with a stranger.

The police department is staffed 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Administrative office hours are Monday through Friday from 8:30 am to 4:30 pm, excluding holidays.

Last year, thanks to Perkasie's involvement, Pine2Pink made a \$21,500 contribution to Grand View Health's Breast Cancer Program. That money is actively being used to support our friends and neighbors. Your support was key to making that donation happen.

We will be turning the town pink in October by having the Electric Department crew install pink gels over street lights along Market, 7th, and Walnut streets. Our "Pink Street" sign will be installed at the intersections of 6th and 7th streets at Market for the month. October 22, 2022 Farmer's Market will be designated Pine2Pink Day.

Last year approximately 20 borough businesses participated as fundraising partners by offering to donate a percentage of sales from certain products and services during the month.






