## **#SHOPPERKASIE, RESOLUTION 2021-9 PASSED**

Residents may see some changes in how restaurants and businesses are operating in the borough in the coming months. Perkasie Borough Council passed Resolution 2021-9 in February to allow borough businesses to operate outdoor sales and dining through December 31st, 2021. These changes are temporary and are intended to assist Borough businesses as they strive to meet Covid-19 guidelines and capacity restrictions.

Perkasie's sidewalks and some outdoor areas will be open for business through the end of the year.

Perkasie Borough Council unanimously voted to pass a resolution allowing outdoor retail sales and dining through Dec. 31, 2021. The new resolution aims to help the retail and restaurant sectors, among those hardest hit by the coronavirus pandemic.

"We're really looking at this resolution in the context of a larger, comprehensive community response to the economic pressures on Perkasie businesses during the pandemic," said Borough Council member Aaron Clark. He is also chair of the Perkasie Borough Council Economic Development Committee.

A similar resolution allowing outdoor retail sales and restaurant dining was approved in June 2020. That resolution expired after 90 days.

"We will be as flexible and as helpful as we can be" to support our business community, said Jim Ryder, borough council president.

Andrea Coaxum, Perkasie Borough manager, said businesses that opt to offer outdoor retails sales or dining may be able to set up temporary structures like tents, under the new resolution.

"Let's be reasonable with these temporary conditions," she said.

But erecting long-term structures or new permanent outdoor fixtures will still be subject to the borough's zoning ordinances and require applicants to go through the regular application processes.

"By passing the resolution we're establishing what temporary means," Coaxum said.

The new resolution aims to provide some "breathing room" for businesses.

Coaxum reported to date there have been no public complaints about outdoor retail sales or dining activities.


From electric rate reductions to working oneon-one with businesses, Clark said the borough is committed to support the community and residents to continue "...shopping, and eating, local."

"This truly is just one piece of a larger response," Clark said.

By passing the resolution now Coaxum said more business owners will have time to prepare for warmer temperatures in spring.

Business owners will be required to make sure sidewalks are clear for pedestrian traffic and should follow Americans with Disabilities (ADA) guidelines when setting up displays or dining seating.

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

- Plant native trees, shrubs and perennials! Native plants have deep root systems which help them to absorb more rain water than non-natives. They also require less maintenance than non-native plants.
- 2) Install a rain barrel. Rain barrels capture water from your roof before it can become polluted storm water runoff. It is also a great source of free water that can be used to water plants or top off a swimming pool.
- Reduce chemical use and never use before it rains. Fertilizers and weed killers can be washed off your property and into nearby waterways when it rains.
- 4) Consider alternatives to traditional pavement. There are many convenient pervious pavement options that reduce stormwater runoff.

In an effort to maintain transparency and provide community information and notifications the Perkasie Police Department provides information via our CrimeWatch web page. The CrimeWatch web page is paid for with funds from the Bucks County District Attorney's Office and provides information on recent arrests, significant events, warrants and criminal activity.

The site also provides information for online reporting of non-emergency crimes, forms such as Right to Know requests, Borough information, vacation check requests, submitting on line tips and Accident Reports through Crash Docs just to name a few services provided on the site.

Recently added to the site was a section to allow residents and businesses to enter security camera information which provides mapping for our officers to see where potential security video may be obtained should an incident occur in that specific area.

## A Message from Magesterial District Judge, Regina Armitage

## How did COVID-19 affect District Court Filings?



Looking back on 2020, it is safe to say that just about everyone and everything was somehow affected by COVID-19. As shutdowns and safety precautions were exercised across the state, adjustments here at District Court were also implemented to help minimize the spread. In bidding the year farewell, I thought this would be a good time to see how COVID affected filings and when I ran data for 2018 and 2019, this is what the system reflected.

It appears motorists caught a break as there were 1454 fewer (-28%) traffic violations issued in 2020. With limited contact becoming commonplace, there is no doubt this decrease was a direct impact of COVID. However, even with the drop in numbers, police


departments in the district were still some of the busiest in Bucks and 2634 citations were filed for the year. Overall, the court ranked #6 (out of 18) in the county for traffic tickets in 2020.


Another area with a marked reduction were non-traffic cases such as disorderly conduct, public intoxication, harassment, etc. With past figures averaging about 360 a year, this docket yielded a 26% decrease in summary citations issued.

The biggest change in 2020 was the Civil & Landlord/Tenant filings. Although they comprise just a small portion of our cases, the court saw only half the filings when compared to prior years. We attribute this 50% decrease to the Emergency Order which stayed all Landlord/Tenant matters and evictions across the state. We do, however, anticipate a surge in this docket after the stay is lifted.

Unfortunately, the area that was minimally affected were Criminal filings. In prior years, Criminal case dockets closed out at 589 (2018) and 528 (2019) respectively, yet 2020's total of 467 showed just a slight decline of 18%.

On the upside, I had the honor of performing 23 wedding ceremonies for couples who would not let COVID-19 get in the way of their love. With an average of 24 weddings per year, it seems we remained right on track for that category, so here's to the happy couples of 2020.

## **Join Perkasie Fire Company!**



All membership in Perkasie Fire Company No. 1 is strictly voluntary. Our members are not "on-call", but if available to respond to the Station when alerted. There are four (4) different types of membership. All monthly meetings and Department training occur on Thursday evenings.

Each member is expected to earn 36 points per year and must attend a minimum of four (4) monthly business meetings per year to remain in Active status. Most of our members achieve annual point levels well above the minimum required. The minimum requirement sets a lower limit that allows members flexibility with work, home, school, etc., but by no means sets a minimum expectation. A minimum of four (4) points must be earned in support of fundraising efforts. Fundraising points are earned at a rate of one (1) point for every two (2) hours of work; therefore a minimum of eight (8) hours of fundraising is required per year. Our primary fundraising events are both breakfasts and food service at community events.

## Firefighters:

All Firefighters are expected to complete and pass a nationally recognized Firefighter I program within their

first year of membership in the Department. Presently the 120 hour class is administered by the Bucks County Community College - Public Safety Training Center in Doylestown, PA. Firefighters earn the balance of their points via a single (1) point for each drill, fire call, training event, and fire prevention activity they attend.

## **Fire Police:**

The Fire Police unit control crowds and direct traffic at fire and emergency scenes, along with community events. Fire Police Members earn the balance of their points via a single (1) point for each drill, fire call, training event, and fire prevention activity they attend.

## **Contributing Member:**

Contributing members support fundraising activities and non-firefighting activities within the fire department. Since Contributing Members do not fight fires, nor attend drills or training, their support is through non-emergency activities.

## **Life Member:**

One can achieve Life Member status after 15 years of Active service in the Department. When designated as a Life Member, accumulation of points is no longer a requirement for membership.

## Perkasie Revitalization: Building a Thoughtful, Sustainable Community

Perkasie's Revitalization plan, initiated in 2013, began with an update to Perkasie's Comprehensive Plan. This guiding document – or "Comp Plan" – serves as the official planning document for the borough, outlining our community's goals and aspirations. The plan was developed with significant public engagement, community surveys, town hall meetings and was formally approved in 2014. Since then, this living document has served as the roadmap for Perkasie's revitalization, identifying priorities for housing supply, business development, park enhancements, environmental protections, roads programs, and much more.


## How is Perkasie's Revitalization supporting our community?

**Thriving Local Economy:** Since the beginning of this process, hundreds of new jobs have been created in Perkasie – many from the more than 50 new businesses that opened in the community, ranging from high-tech manufacturing to small retailers and restaurants. Local employment keeps local dollars in our community, resulting in an increasingly vibrant town center with successful, locally owned businesses.

**Increasing Property Values:** In 2020, property values continued to rise. There were 149 real estate transactions this past year for both residential and commercial properties totaling \$47,235,180. Another real estate trend we have encouraged and observed is the investment and renovation of Perkasie's majestic town center and recognizable Victorian homes.



**Investing In Our Parks:** Park improvements over the past several years have been a direct result of new growth, made possible through Developer Impact Fees. The new Menlo Park playground, the updates to the Menlo Park pavilions, upgrades to the Spruce Street tot lot and trail improvements are just a few examples of how development impact fees have benefited our community. The





Perkasie's Town Center and Walnut Street District continue to see many new additions for residents to enjoy, including:.

- The Ram Pub is officially open and will shortly unveil its rooftop restaurant and outdoor seating area.
- Walnut Street welcomes **Haasis Gluten Free Bakery** a Perkasie Farmer's Market favorite for gluten-free goodies.
- With the opening of two new micro breweries **Mystic Ways Brewing** and **Van Lieus Brewing**, both on Walnut St.
- This Spring, **Sole Kombucha Company** plans to open its first retial location on W. Market Street, initially offering their locally made, bottled kombucha to go. Kombucha is a fermented, lightly effervescent, sweetened black or green tea drink commonly consumed for its health benefits. - Pleasant Spring Mini Golf is set to open their gates next to Dairy Queen on Constitution Ave. later this spring.





It is closed Sundays and most holidays.

The Borough Recycling Center, located behind the Perkasie Police Department, at 311 South 9th Street, is for the convenience of **Borough Residents ONLY.** Perkasie Borough staff may ask for identification when you use the Center. There are signs indicating where recyclable materials are to be placed. **No plastic bags, please.** Combine glass, aluminum, tin and plastic (PDE #1-7) containers in the dumpsters that are marked as such and that have metal stairs. Combine newspaper and cardboard and place in the trailer.

Trash and bulky items are not accepted at the Recycling Center. Absolutely NO construction materials, aluminum/plastic siding, window glass, shutters, etc. are accepted at the Recycling Center. No laundry baskets, plastic trash cans, large tin (popcorn) containers, fish tanks, mirrors or other household materials are accepted. As of June 1, 2010 yard waste (NO GRASS CLIPPINGS) will be accepted on the first Saturday of the month 7:30 AM - 3:30 PM. Please use brown paper bags, lawn and leaf bags or bring a container to be dumped when disposing of yard waste. **No plastic bags.** Please call the Borough or check the website for additional information.



## **10 Spring Energy Savings Tips**

Warmer weather gets us thinking about being outside and enjoying the sunshine. But, we also wonder how high our electricity bills will be when we are cooling off inside. If you are looking to cut your cooling costs without sacrificing your family's comfort and summer fun, check out the following energy savers tips.

## 1. Use Your Ceiling Fans

Did you know that the average ceiling fan, run at its highest speed, consumes about 75 watts of power? Now, compare that to an air conditioner that consumes roughly 2,000 watts of power! Also, cooling your home with ceiling fans will allow you to possibly raise your thermostat by roughly four degrees, which can further reduce your energy bill by up to 30 percent!

## 2. Update Your Windows

During the spring and summer, direct sunlight can significantly warm up your home. You can prevent UV rays from bringing unwanted heat into your house, as a way to reduce your energy bill. If you cannot update your windows, invest in heavily-insulated drapes to block even more heat from entering your home as an additional way to save energy in the spring.

## 3. Check Seals Around Your Windows and Doors

Letting hot air into your home — or cold air out — due to gaps around your windows and doors might be costing you more than you expect. According to The U.S. Department of Energy, sealing any leaks or drafts in your home can save you between 5 and 30 percent per year in energy costs.

Sealing leaks on your doors and windows is a simple process, too. All you need is caulk or weatherstripping materials and you can block unwanted airflow in a snap.

## 4. Manage Airflow

You can manage the airflow in a number of ways. The first is by using exhaust fans strategically. Exhaust fans pull the warm air from your home and send it outside, on particularly warm days, turn your bathroom and kitchen exhaust fans on to force warm air outside to decrease the use of your AC.

You can also rearrange your furniture away from your heating and cooling systems baseboard or registers. By moving obstacles away from your home's airflow, you can maximize circulation, heating and cooling more of your home.

## 5. Check Your Refrigerator Gasket

You might be surprised to learn that a refrigerator accounts for almost 14 percent of the average homeowner's electrical bill, according to the U.S. Department of Energy.

Try to ensure all of your refrigerator's components are running well, so it doesn't take up more energy than normal. That's why you should inspect your refrigerator gaskets often.

(Your refrigerator gasket is the rubber seal around the inside of the door and is responsible for keeping the cold air in. If this gasket breaks or cracks, it can allow the warm air inside of your home to enter your refrigerator, causing the compressor to work harder to maintain a cool temperature, and increasing your electricity bill.)

## 6. Upgrade Your Lighting

If you're still using incandescent bulbs, you should know that only 10 percent of the electricity they consume is used for light, the rest is turned into heat. Not only does that mean you're paying more for less light, but you're also unknowingly warming your home.

Opt for more efficient lights like LEDs, which according to the Department of Energy use at least 75 percent less energy and last 25 times longer than incandescent lighting.

## 7. Get Your AC Tuned-up by a Licensed Professional

If you have a unit and get your air conditioner tuned up in the spring, you'll prevent yourself from potential meltdowns in the summer. It's important to call in a professional to tune-up your AC so you and your family can be safe!

(Air conditioners are high voltage, and without proper knowledge and equipment, it can be dangerous to take a tune-up on as a DIY project.)

## 8. Check Your Water Heater

First things first, check the thermostat on your current water heater. Many manufacturers automatically set water heater thermostats to 140°F, though 120°F will work for your home just fine.

Adjusting the thermostat to 120° will help you avoid scalding temperatures when you turn on your hot water, and will also cut energy costs. Even when you're not actively using your water heater, reducing the temperature will save you \$36 to \$61, annually, in standby heat savings. And, adjusting the heat down will save you more than \$400 per year, during active water heater use, according to The U.S. Department of Energy.

## 9. Conserve Hot Water

While you're at it, don't just focus on the cleanliness of your hot water heater, also pay attention to how frequently you use it. Minimizing the amount of hot water you use throughout the year can save you on your energy bills.

## 10. Know Your AC Thermostat

Remember, you are in control of how frequently your system runs! Complete control over your thermostat is especially useful during the spring when we experience colder nights and warmer days. That's because constantly adjusting the temperature inside your home can be a costly mistake: The cooler you keep your home with an air conditioner, the higher your electric bills will be.

According to the U.S Department of Energy, 78° F is the most efficient temperature to run your AC when you're home. While you're away, it's best to keep the thermostat at 85°. Adjusting your temperature down to just 72° can increase your energy bills by roughly 47 percent.

## A message from the Code Enforcement Department

Springtime means growth, which also means it is time to keep an eye on your trees and shrubbery on your property! It is especially important for line of sight around corners to avoid any obstruction for pedestrian and vehicle traffic. Please see the ordinance below and make sure to keep your trees trimmed.



#### § 175-3Requirements for trimming trees.

It shall be the duty of the owners of real estate in the Borough of Perkasie to trim and keep trimmed all trees located upon such property and along or near to any street in the Borough, so that:

- **A.** The limbs and/or branches thereof shall in no way interfere with electric wires and other wires lawfully suspended along such street. There shall be a clearance of at least 10 feet from all electrical wires and utility poles to all branches, limbs, or trunks and any other portion of the tree which may be overhanging any electric wires or utility poles. [Amended 3-6-2017 by Ord. No. 1003]
- **B.** The limbs and/or branches thereof shall not obscure or obstruct the light from any streetlight.
- **C.** No part of such tree or the limbs and/or branches and foliage thereof shall obstruct the view of the said street and/or traffic thereon by persons operating vehicles upon such street or any intersecting street.
- **D.** There shall be a clearance of at least 14 feet from the surface of the street and at least eight feet from the surface of the sidewalk to the lowest branch or limb of such tree or any other overhanging part thereof.
- **E.** No portion of the trunk of any tree shall encroach horizontally over the roadway of the street or over the paved portion of the sidewalk.
- **F.** Any tree upon a property which is dead or substantially diseased shall be removed by the owner of the property on or in front of which the same is located in instances where damage to neighboring property and/or Borough property is imminent. [Added 3-6-2017 by Ord. No. 1003]



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
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
