PERKASIE BOROUGH PREPARES FOR LONG-AWAITED PENNDOT ROAD IMPROVEMENTS

PennDOT recently announced plans to resurface PA State Road 4039 in Perkasie Borough. The project – tentatively planned for 2024 - will bring much needed improvements to these state-owned sections of N. 5th Street and W. Market Street in Perkasie Borough.

- N 5th Street from W. Blooming Glen Drive /Borough Line to W. Market Street
- W. Market Street from N 7th Street to N. Ridge Road

We sent a letter to alert property owners on these roads that curbs, sidewalks and driveway aprons at their property will need to meet the specifications in Perkasie Borough Code in advance of PennDOT's resurfacing project. Please contact admin@perkasieborough.org if you would like a copy of the letter, which described the project timelines and their responsibilities with regard to curb, sidewalk and apron remediation.


Perkasie Borough engineers conducted inspections of curbs, sidewalks, and driveway aprons along State Road 4039 in the spring of 2022 and will send out detailed inspection reports to property owners where the curb, sidewalk or driveway requires repair or replacement. Property owners who elect to use a private contractor will need to complete repairs by July 2023. Property owners who elect to use the Borough's contractor can expect to see the work complete during the summer of 2023.


The Borough will offer a financing plan for those who participate in the Borough's repair program in 2023. An estimate of the costs of having the Borough do the work and more information about the financing plan will be sent to affected property owners.

Perkasie Borough provided advance notice of this project because of the number of properties involved, the lead time it may take property owners to obtain quotes and schedule work, and because many of the affected properties have substantial road frontage and the cost of bringing curbs, sidewalks and aprons into compliance could be significant.

RECYCLING CENTER HOURS

Monday through Friday: 7:30 am - 8:30 pm Saturdays: 7:30 am - 4:00 pm Closed Sundays and most holidays. The Borough Recycling Center, located behind the Perkasie Police Department, at 311 South 9th Street, is for the convenience of **Borough Residents ONLY**. Perkasie Borough staff may ask for identification when you use the Center. There are signs indicating where recyclable materials are to be placed. **No plastic bags, please.** Combine glass, aluminum, tin and plastic (PDE #1-7) containers in the dumpsters that are marked as such and that have metal stairs. Combine newspaper and cardboard and place in the trailer.

<u>Trash and bulky items are not accepted at the Recycling Center.</u> Absolutely NO construction materials, aluminum/plastic siding, window glass, shutters, etc. are accepted at the Recycling Center. No laundry baskets, plastic trash cans, large tin (popcorn) containers, fish tanks, mirrors or other household materials are accepted. Yard Waste (NO GRASS CLIPPINGS) will be accepted on the first Saturday of the month 7:30 AM - 3:30 PM. Please use brown paper bags, lawn and leaf bags or bring a container to be dumped when disposing of yard waste. **No plastic bags.** Please call the Borough or check the website for additional information.

- 1) **Wash your car at a car wash.** When you wash your car on the driveway or the street, grease, soap and oil can wash into streams and creeks.
- 2) **Never dump anything down stormwater drains.** Remember that storm drains empty directly into local waterways without being treated so whatever enters storm drains will flow into streams and creeks.
- 3) **Direct downspouts over porous, not paved surfaces.** Where possible, direct downspouts into garden beds, your lawn or consider installing a rain barrel.
- 4) **Raise your mower height.** Raising your mower height to at least 3 inches will slow of the flow of water over your lawn and allow it to absorb more rain water.

A Message From The Perkasie Borough Police Department

The police department would like to remind all residents to double check to make sure your vehicles are kept locked, even when in your driveway. Theft from vehicles is generally a crime of opportunity with offenders looking for unlocked/unsecured vehicles that may contain cell phones, cash, computers and other valuables.

With vacation season upon us you may contact the Perkasie Borough Police Department at our non-emergency number 215-257-6876 to notify our officers that you will be away on vacation.

With the warmer weather we will see more pedestrian traffic throughout the area. AAA offers the following tips for Pedestrians and Drivers;

Pedestrian Tips

Be Visible

- Make sure you're visible to drivers at all times and make eye contact with them whenever possible. This is especially important at night, in lowlight conditions such as dusk or dawn or in inclement weather. According to NHTSA's National Center for Statistics and Analysis, 32 percent of all pedestrian fatalities occur between 8 p.m. and 11:59 p.m.
- Wear lightly colored or reflective clothing at night and brightly colored clothing during the day.
- Stay in well-lit areas, especially when crossing the street.
- If possible, make eye contact with drivers in stopped vehicles to ensure they see you before you cross in front of them.

Stay Alert – Avoid Distractions

- Distractions are everywhere today and becoming more and more difficult to avoid. Remember that, as a pedestrian, your eyes and ears are your best tools for keeping safe. Stay alert and watch out.
- Put down your phone. Smartphones and handheld electronic devices are a daily part of life, but they take your eyes off of the road and distract your attention.
- Don't wear headphones. Your ears will tell you a lot about what is happening around you – be sure to use them.

Follow the Rules

 Know and follow all traffic rules, signs and signals. You need to be aware of the rules vehicles around you must follow to properly anticipate what drivers will do. This will help increase your safety.

- Never assume a driver will give you the right of way. Make every effort to make eye contact with the driver of a stopped or approaching vehicle before entering the roadway.
- Walk in Safe Places
 - Use crosswalks when crossing the street. If a crosswalk is unavailable, be sure to find the most well-lit spot on the road to cross and wait for a long enough gap in traffic to make it safely across the street.
 - Stay on sidewalks whenever possible.
 If a sidewalk is not available, be sure to
 walk on the far side of the road facing
 traffic. This will help increase your
 visibility to drivers.
 - Avoid walking along highways or other roadways where pedestrians are prohibited.
- Avoid Alcohol Consumption
 - Almost half of all traffic crashes resulting in pedestrian casualties involve alcohol consumption.
 Surprisingly, 34 percent of that total was on the part of the pedestrian.
 Alcohol impairs your decisionmaking skills, physical reflexes and other abilities just as much on your feet as it does behind the wheel.

Tips for Drivers

Be Alert

- Look out for pedestrians at all times.
 When you are operating a vehicle,
 you have accepted a heightened
 responsibility for other people on the
 road. Safety is a two-way street. Often,
 pedestrians— especially younger
 ones— are not where they should be
 or where you would expect them to
 be. Remain vigilant at all times.
- Follow posted speed limits at all times, especially in areas of heavy pedestrian traffic. This is even more important in areas that have lower speed limits, such as school zones and neighborhood streets where pedestrians may appear suddenly.
- Stay Alert Avoid Distractions Put down your phone. Smartphones and handheld electronic devices take your eyes off of the road and distract your attention.
- Overall visibility is limited in bad weather conditions and poorly lit areas.


Not only is it more difficult for drivers to see oncoming pedestrians, it also is harder for pedestrians to see you. Make sure your lights are on and you use your signals properly. Use extra caution in these circumstances.

- Be mindful of pedestrians when pulling into and out of driveways – especially if you are backing up. Pedestrians can easily enter your path without your knowledge.
- Crosswalks
 - Always yield to pedestrians in a crosswalk.
 - When approaching a crosswalk, reduce your speed and be prepared to stop.
 - When you are stopped at a crosswalk, allow enough room between your vehicle and the crosswalk so other drivers can see the pedestrians you have stopped for.
 - Do not pass vehicles stopped at a crosswalk. They have stopped to allow pedestrians to pass or make sure the way is clear.
- Do Not Drive Under the Influence of Alcohol, Drugs or Drowsy Driving
- Alcohol, drugs, and fatigue impair your reaction time, reflexes, decisionmaking skills and overall cognitive functions. Getting behind the wheel while impaired or tired puts everyone in danger.

The police department is staffed 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Administrative office hours are Monday through Friday from 8:30 am to 4:30 pm, excluding holidays. The Police Department non-emergency contact phone number is 215-257-6876. For emergencies, please dial 911.

A Reminder to Residents from the Code **Enforcement Department**

The Borough wants to remind residents of Perkasie Borough Code and the Property Maintenance Code -

Grass or weeds or vegetation should not be permitted to grown over 10 inches in height in livable spaces. Any grass, weeds, or other vegetation growing upon any premises in the Borough in violation of any of the provisions of this ordinance is hereby declared to be a nuisance and detrimental to the health, safety, cleanliness and comfit of the inhabitants of the Borough.

Tree limbs, branches, and bushes must be trimmed to a height of 14 feet from the surface of the street and 8 feet from the surface of the sidewalk. The sidewalk should also be clear of any side obstructions and maintain a clear width of 4 feet. These requirements allow for vehicles and pedestrians to have safe access around roads and sidewalks.





How Weather Affects Your Electric Bill

Weather is the biggest reason for fluctuations in your bill. On average, 55-60% of your electric bill is made up of heating and cooling costs. Throughout the summer, one month's bill can differ greatly from another, as the summer weather can sometimes be very unpredictable.

When the temperature is 65 degrees Fahrenheit outside, your system doesn't have to work very hard to maintain a comfortable temperature. When the average temperature outside rises above 65 degrees Fahrenheit, your system works harder to cool your house. That's why hot weather can affect your electric bill, even if you leave your thermostat

on a constant setting. As you move into the summer, the temperature remains hotter for a longer period of time.

These increases are a normal part of electric consumption. Your lifestyle can also cause an unusually high bill. As the weather gets much warmer, you may find yourself gradually adjusting the thermostat. Your cooling system works around the clock – even when you're asleep. Continuously adjusting the thermostat can have an effect on the amount of electricity you use. It's best to leave it at a comfortable temperature, especially if you have an all-electric heat pump, which performs best when left on one setting.

Even though we can't control the weather, there are plenty of ways to help conserve energy for the next time a heat wave hits. Try some of the tips below to help save on your energy bill:

- Set your programmable thermostat to an ideal temperature that will help you to stay cool while keeping your energy bill low. Give your air conditioner and energy bill a break while you are away and set your thermostat to a higher temperature.
- Seal drafty windows and doors! You can even use draft protectors. Keep the warm air out and the cold air in!
- Replace your HVAC filters as recommended by the manufacturer. Clogged and dirty air filters will require you HVAC system to work harder and use more energy.
- Set your ceiling fans to turn counter clockwise in the summer. This will help to push the cool air back down into the room.
- Set your thermostat fan to 'auto' instead of 'on'. When you use the auto fan setting the fan will only run when your HVAC is running, not continuously, which would be an energy waster.

Perkasie Facade Grants Help New Businesses Open

This past year the Borough and Perkasie Towne Improvement Association (PTIA) have worked together to incentivize and grow new and existing businesses in Perkasie. Throughout the year PTIA has administered a \$50,000 Facade Matching Grant. The grant allowed businesses to submit facade improvement requests for up to \$5,000 each in matching funds.

Perkasie's newest micro-breweries, Van Lieus Brewing Company and Mystic Ways Brewing Co., both on Walnut Street took advantage of the Facade Grants to improve and renovate their buildings. Mystic Ways used their grant to open up the walls of their tasting room and install large windows. Van Lieus Brewing utilized grant funds for new exterior improvements on their building which had formerly been an auto repair shop.

"The Facade Grant Program provided us with financial assistance to greatly improve the outside appearance of our new brewery, including a new coat of paint and contrasting black metal signage," relayed Van Lieus Brewer and co-owner Galen Barr. "We couldn't be happier with the outcome."

"We have been very happy with the response so far," said Joe Ferry, PTIA President. "Almost all of the money has been committed and we are starting to see the benefits of those improvements. Many thanks to Mike Engard for his guidance in helping the businesses fine-tune the applications so they can move smoothly through the process."

"The facade grant has helped us tremendously," said Alice Krier, one of the owners of Mystic Ways. "We have used the funds to open up the walls of the tasting room to create a charming and inviting space, with lots of natural light that brings the outside in. It's beautiful."

"Participating in this program means supporting the heart of what makes our community unique," said Ferry.

Studies have shown that local independent retailers recirculate 47% of their revenue back into the community, while only 14% of national chains' revenue stays in the community. More dramatically, local restaurants recirculate 73% of their revenue back into the community, versus only 30% for national chains.

By supporting local businesses, more money continues circulating through the local community—this is achieved through a combination of profits paid to local business owners, wages paid to local workers, goods and services procured locally for internal use or resale, and charitable giving within the community.




