PERKASIE FIRE COMPANY



The Perkasie Fire Company has a long history dating back to a disastrous fire in June of 1890. The fire began at the livery stable located at 7th and Chestnut Streets; twelve buildings were destroyed. Personal buckets and ladders were used to try and extinguish the fire until the nearest fire company could arrive from Sellersville. Soon after, a committee appointed by Perkasie Borough Council met to form the Hope Fire Company which would later, in 1892, be renamed to the Perkasie Fire Company.

There have been numerous fires in our community's history that the Perkasie Fire Company has responded to in the last 133 years and it has become a vital community asset, providing fire response and rescue services 24 hours a day to the residents of Perkasie Borough, East Rockhill and Hilltown Townships, as well as other communities including Sellersville Borough, Silverdale Borough, and West Rockhill Township. The company boasts an average response time of three to five minutes.

Numbering almost 50 highly trained volunteer firefighters and 15 Fire Police Officers Perkasie's

FD provides many services in addition to fire response. Members will often be involved in crowd and traffic control at fire and emergency scenes. They provide support to the community at events such as parades, Community Day, Fall Fest, car shows, and football games. The Perkasie Fire Company is an active member of the Bucks County Technical Rescue Task Force and the Bucks County Regional Fire Task Force.

The men and women who volunteer their time are also very involved in the Pennridge community, working with the Perkasie Police Department in the "Toys for Tots" program and assisting at local Veterans Day and Memorial Day observances. You'll also find

A reminder of Parking Restrictions for Snow Events and Emergencies

To help Borough crews with the removal of snow from streets, the Borough Code of Ordinances restricts parking on some Borough streets when there are three or more inches of snow. The schedule of streets regulated by § 180-18.1 is as follows:

- Hunters Run east side, entire length
- Parkridge both sides, entire length
- South Seventh Street east side, from Borough Hall parking lot entrance to West Chestnut Street
- West Chestnut Street south side, from South Seventh Street to Borough Hall parking lot exit

Snow Emergency Routes

When there is snow accumulation of three inches or more, the Borough Code of Ordinances prohibits parking on these <u>snow</u> <u>emergency routes</u>.

- Arthur Avenue both sides, from Elm Street to South Fifth Street
- · Callowhill Street both sides, entire length (except south side only from Fifth Street to Seventh Street)
- Constitution Avenue both sides, entire length
- Fifth Street west side, entire length
- Main Street west side, entire length
- Market Street south side only, from Fourth Street to Fifth Street
- South Fourth Street both sides, from Cedar Avenue to Elm Street
- West Blooming Glen Drive both sides, entire length
- West Park Avenue both sides, from Fifth Street to Ridge Road (except south side only from Fifth Street to Ninth Street)
- West Walnut Street north side only, from Seventh Street to Constitution Avenue
- West Market Street south side, from Ridge Road to Fifth Street

Town Center Clean Up – Parking Restrictions

Perkasie Borough crews work to remove snow from the center of town after a snow storm at night, usually beginning at midnight. The roads will be marked with No Parking signs in advance, if possible. Parking will be restricted for snow removal as follows:

- 7th Street from Arch to Walnut
- Arch Street from 7th to 6th
- Market Street from N. 6th to Railroad
- Chestnut Street from 6th to 7th
- Walnut Street from 5th to 7th
- 6th Street from Market to Walnut
- 7th in front of Electric Department
- Area around Post Office at 7th & Vine Street
- Main Street in area of The Perk

Winter Snow Reminders from the Code Enforcement Department

The snow has stopped and now it is time to clear your driveway and sidewalks.

Please do not pile, shovel, or snow blow your snow into the street. Waiting until the plows are done clearing your street before attempting to clear your driveway/parking space. It may take a plow 2 or 3 passes on the road to ensure proper and safe travel lanes.

Cul-de-sacs are the most difficult and time consuming streets to plow. Plowing a cul-de-sac can take up to eight times longer than a through street of the same size because of the limited amount of space to deposit snow without burying driveways, mailboxes, and fire hydrants.

Please do not travel on roads during a snow event unless it is absolutely necessary. Do not use your snowmobiles or all-terrain vehicles on the roadways. Snow plow operators have to concentrate on the roadways with the additional vehicles on them.

nter Stormwater Management

Here are some tips for managing stormwater on

your property this winter:

Perkasie Borough Ordinance§ 152-2 states that all business and commercial premises within the Borough shall remove snow from their sidewalks within 6 hours after the snow, sleet, or freezing rain has stopped. All residents shall have all snow, sleet, or freezing rain removed from their sidewalks within 18 hours after the snow has stopped. For your safety and the safety of others, be sure you make plans to comply.


1) **Dispose of shoveled snow in vegetated areas**. This will allow the snow to infiltrate instead of becoming runoff.

2) **Use de-icing chemicals and salt sparingly.** Focus on making your walkways and driveways safe, but avoid overusing or spreading in vegetated areas or near waterways.

3) **Start shoveling early!** The more snow you remove, the less salt you will need.

4) **Make sure your nearest storm drains are clear.** Do not pile snow on storm drains and make sure your neighborhood plow is not piling snow over the drain.



Message from Perkasie Electric Department

In coming months, we will be replacing our electric meter on your property as part of our Borough Council approved plan to upgrade all our customers' electric meters. Your new meter will benefit you in several ways: It will help us improve the reliability of your service by better detecting power outages. And, over time, the new meters will give you improved access to data that will help you manage your energy use.

Here's what you can expect during the replacement:

- Borough employees will perform the meter replacement work during the work week between 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. The employees
 will be in Borough marked vehicles, wearing Borough clothing, with Borough identification. All residents have the option to call
 the Borough if they are unsure if it's a Borough employee at their door or a scammer.
- The technician performing the installation will knock on your door before they begin working. The installation will take about 10 minutes to complete, during which time you may briefly lose power.
- You do not need to be home for the installation as long as the meter is outdoors and our technicians have clear and safe access.
- If our electric meter is located indoors, or in another location that is inaccessible, you will need to be present to provide access. Installations will take place from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. If your meter is not accessible and you will not be available during these hours over the next few months, please contact 215-257-5065 to schedule an appointment.

We are committed to keeping all of our customers informed before their meters are replaced, this project will be completed in 3 years, and new letters will go out each year to the residents that have not had their meter replaced yet.

Collection and Disposal of Refuse Reminders

The Borough Recycling Center, located behind the Perkasie Police Department, at 311 South 9th Street, is for the convenience of Borough Residents ONLY. Hours are Monday through Friday 7:30am-8:30pm and Saturdays 7:30am-4:00pm. As a reminder it is CLOSED Sundays and most holidays. Perkasie Borough staff may ask for identification when you use the Center. There are signs indicating where recyclable materials are to be placed. No plastic bags, please. Combine glass, aluminum, tin and plastic (PDE #1-7) containers in the dumpsters that are marked as such and that have metal stairs. Combine newspaper and cardboard and place in the recycling shed at the rear of the center. Trash and bulky items are not accepted at the Recycling Center.

HOLIDAY TREE PICKUP

Christmas trees (without wire, lights, ornaments, or stands) are picked up for chipping first few weeks of January. Please place your trees curbside before 7:00am. Wreaths with or without wire will be collected with refuse.

Live-balled Christmas trees may be donated for planting in Borough parks.

As we approach winter driving season AAA offers the following driving tips on how to drive safely in winter conditions;

- Remove all ice and snow from your vehicle before you start driving.
- To defrost your windows, set the temperature control to hot and let the engine warm up, which helps keep frost from forming inside. If the windshield and side windows fog on the inside, open a window slightly and set the fan to a higher speed.
- During snow or other low-visibility winter driving conditions, drive with your low-beam headlights on to make it easier for other drivers to see you.
- Brake, accelerate and steer gently, gradually and smoothly.
- If you encounter a snowplow or salt trucks, allow plenty of space and don't try to pass.



- Clean your headlight lenses periodically, such as when you stop for gas, to remove grime from slushy streets. Clear any snow and ice from your vehicle as well, as it can fly off and strike other vehicles.
- Obey the Basic Speed Law any time there's a possibility of icy roads. This means never traveling at speeds that aren't reasonable and safe for conditions. It's important to reduce speed because you may encounter patches of black ice that are difficult or impossible to see. Bridges, ramps, overpasses and shaded areas may become icy before other surfaces. Be cautious at intersections, where stopping and starting vehicles can polish the ice, making it slicker.
- Wind gusts can make steering on ice more difficult, so it's critical to reduce speed during windy conditions. Be aware that buildings can cause sudden changes in wind direction.

Safety Tips

When holiday shopping, always make sure your vehicles are kept locked and valuables are kept out of sight and be aware of your surroundings when entering or exiting your vehicle and always park in a well-lit area.

Even when parked in your driveway, residents should ensure that their vehicles are kept locked with valuables out of sight. Never leave your vehicle unattended while running especially with young children in the vehicle. Not only is this practice dangerous but it is a violation of the law. Most thefts from vehicles occur because the owner/operator left the vehicle unlocked. Most stolen vehicles are the result of keys being left in the vehicle or because the vehicle was left running with the keys in the vehicle and unattended.

HOW TO AVOID A SCAM

FOUT SIGNS THAT IT'S A SCAM

Scammers PRETEND to be from an organization you know. Scammers often pretend to be contacting you on behalf of the government. They might use a real name, like the Social Security Administration, the IRS, or Medicare, or make up a name that sounds official. Some pretend to be from a business you know, like a utility company, a tech company, or even a charity asking for

donations. They use technology to change the phone number that appears on your caller ID. So the name and number you see might not be real.

Scammers say there's a PROBLEM or a PRIZE. They might say you're in trouble with the government. Or you owe money. Or someone in your family had an emergency. Or that there's a virus on your computer. Some scammers say there's a problem with one of your accounts and that you need to verify some information. Others will lie and say you won money in a lottery or sweepstakes but have to pay a fee to get it.

Scammers PRESSURE you to act immediately. Scammers want you to act before you have time to think. If you're on the phone, they might tell you not to hang up so you can't check out their story. They might threaten to arrest you, sue you, take away your driver's or business license, or deport you. They might say your computer is about to be corrupted.

Scammers tell you to PAY in a specific way. They often insist that you pay by sending money through a money transfer company or by putting money on a gift card and then giving them the number on the back. Some will send you a check (that will later turn out to be fake), tell you to deposit it, and then send them money.

WHAT YOU CAN DO TO AVOID A SCAM

Block unwanted calls and text messages. Take steps to block unwanted calls and to filter unwanted text messages.

Don't give your personal or financial information in response to a request that you didn't expect. Legitimate organizations won't call, email, or text to ask for your personal information, such as your Social Security, bank account, or credit card numbers. If you get an email or text message from a company you do business with and you think it's real, it's still best not to click on any links. Instead, contact them using a website you know is trustworthy. Or look up their phone number. Don't call a number they gave you or the number from your caller ID.

3 Resist the pressure to act immediately. Legitimate businesses will give you time to make a decision. Anyone who pressures you to pay or give them your personal information is a scammer.

• Know how scammers tell you to pay. Never pay someone who insists you pay with a gift card or by using a money transfer service. And never deposit a check and send money back to someone.

5. Stop and talk to someone you trust. Before you do anything else, tell someone — a friend, a family member, a neighbor — what happened. Talking about it could help you realize it's a scam.

If you were scammed or think you saw a scam, report it to the Federal Trade Commission at ReportFraud.ftc.gov.

Local historian Chase Palmer will be speaking about the one-room schoolhouses of Bucks County. Chase is a native of Bucks County from Richboro and currently resides in Solebury Township. His previous work includes research on the Arnold Brothers postcards. His current research includes documenting and mapping all 250+ one-room schoolhouses that were used Bucks County from the early 1800s, until school district consolidation in the early-mid 1900s. Chase will be discussing his research sources and photos discovered thus far.

"Snow plowing of streets and roadways, park service drives, municipal parking lots, sidewalks on Borough-owned properties, and any emergency needs are to take priority over snow removal. However, removal of snow from the designated areas is to be a priority of plowing of snow from municipal bike paths."

The Borough trails will be cleared when possible, but snow and ice covered areas may remain for an extended period of time after a storm. Surfaces may be slippery. Residents may still access the parks for winter recreation activities; however, they do so at their own risk.






